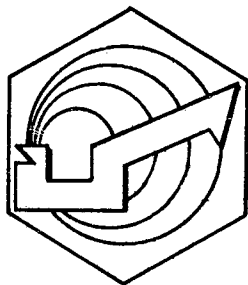

FOREWORD

This marks the third issue of the handbook on *Selected Statistics on Agriculture* and carries with it revisions of data in the previous issues. These revisions were made because the Bureau of Agricultural Statistics (BAS) intends to improve the presentation of data with every issue of the *Handbook* to be able to provide its users a handy but comprehensive update of selected agricultural statistics. In this issue, the changes include the following: (1) wage rate indices using constant 1985 prices; (2) revision of the 1980-1987 sugarcane data using the updated centrifugal sugar data series from the Sugar Regulatory Administration and the inclusion of panocha and molasses products; (3) revision of the food and feed estimates of corn, thereby effecting some changes in the supply-use table; (4) inclusion of the regional average income of farm households for calendar year 1987; (5) adjustment of percent shares in total production value of major crops from 1981 to 1987 based on the new sugarcane figures; and (6) revision of the 1981 to 1987 birds hatched alive data.

Since the first issue came off the press, this *Handbook* has been in demand by various users. Its publication, therefore, shall henceforth be a regular activity of the Crops, Livestock, Poultry and Fishery Statistics Division (CLPFSD) of the BAS.
