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FOREWORD

This is the 9th issue of the *Handbook on Selected Statistics on Agriculture* updating the annual data series to 1997. Data of a few commodities in the previous issues were revised to reflect results of data review and validation activities and latest available information.

The revision includes the data on abaca, pineapple and sweet potato to reflect results of the objective survey and data validation undertaken through the BAS-BAR High Value Crops Development Program (HVCCDP). This data validation took into consideration data of the LGUs and FIDA for abaca.

Gross farm value of sugarcane has been revised based on the volume and price of raw sugar produced during the reference period as well as the planter-miller sharing system in the industry.

For tuna, the data were revised downward to include the four tuna species only.

As in the past issues, we welcome comments and suggestions from our readers and users on how to improve this handbook in terms of coverage, data presentation and the like.

RECENT DEVELOPMENTS IN THE PHILIPPINE AGRICULTURE SECTOR

Economic Performance. Over the period 1993 to 1997, the agriculture sector has grown by an annual average of 2.74 percent. In 1997 when the nation faced economic uncertainties due to the regional currency crisis and the long dry spell, the sector pulled through with a creditable 2.90 percent output gain from the previous year's level. In the last five years, agriculture posted an average share of about 22 percent to the GDP. Specifically, 20.89 percent of the 1997 GDP was attributed to agriculture. During this year, the subsectoral contributions to the total agricultural output were as follows: crops, 53.55 percent; livestock, 13.09 percent; poultry, 14.17 percent; and fishery, 19.20 percent.

Population, Employment and Wages. About 28.6 million persons depended on agriculture for their livelihood. In 1997, agriculture employed 11.32 million persons representing 40.8 percent of the country's total employment. Significantly, 50.1 percent of the employed females in the rural areas were in agriculture. The average daily wage rate in agriculture has been going up by an average of 11.13 percent yearly. In 1996, farm laborers were receiving an average daily wage of P101.16 in nominal terms. In real terms, farm wages were increasing by 3.11 percent annually and the 1996 equivalent of the money wage was P44.45.

Support Services. Based on the records of the Department of Budget and Management, the government has obligated a total of P18.0 billion to support the 1997 agricultural expenditure. This amount was 3.65 percent of the total national government expenditures for the same period. Meanwhile, loans granted in 1996 amounted to P4,665 billion of which only 1.49 percent were agricultural loans. To enhance production and productivity in agriculture, the government has provided irrigation services to the farms. In 1997, about 1.34 million hectares were covered by irrigation and drainage facilities; this was approximately 43 percent of the total potential irrigable area of the country. In terms of fertilizer requirements, domestic production was being supplemented by importations. About 56.4 percent of the fertilizer supply in 1997 were imported.

Food Sufficiency. For the past five years, the country has not been self-sufficient in rice and corn. In 1997, rice and corn imports amounted to 731 thousand metric tons and 302.96 thousand metric tons, respectively. There was heavier dependency on importation in the cases of garlic, peanut, and mungo. For its beef requirements, the country had to import 18.5 percent of its total supply. On the other hand, local producers were found to have the capability to sufficiently address the domestic consumption needs for coconut, sugar and most of the fruits, vegetables and rootcrops. By and large, the country was producing quantities of poultry and fishery products enough for its population. However, in 1997, some 1.44 thousand metric tons of poultry products and 175.12 thousand metric tons of fishery products flowed into the country.
