

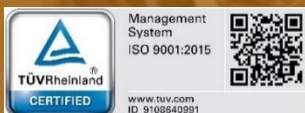

The Cattle Situation Report presents the industry situation in terms of volume and value of production; number of heads slaughtered in slaughterhouses; supply and disposition; volume and value of beef imports; and monthly average farmgate and retail prices.

The Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) disseminates the Cattle Situation Report annually, every March, with previous year as the reference period. The report serves as a ready reference for PSA's various clients and stakeholders in the agriculture sector.

The PSA would appreciate comments and suggestions from our data users and readers for further improvement of this report.

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TECHNICAL NOTES

The data in this report are collected by the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) through two major surveys, namely:

1. Backyard Livestock and Poultry Survey (BLPS) which covers one of the four replicate samples of the Palay Production Survey (PPS) and Corn Production Survey (CPS). BLPS consists of 15,876 sample households in 1,560 sample barangays nationwide; and
2. Commercial Livestock and Poultry Survey (CLPS) which covers 695 cattle farms as of January 2019.

For cattle, both surveys are conducted semi-annually, that is, every January and July in all provinces.

Another activity that supplements the statistical requirements of the livestock and poultry sub-sector is the Compilation of Data from Slaughterhouses and Poultry Dressing Plants (CDSPDP). This covers around 1,265 licensed to operate meat establishments (AAA, AA) and Locally Registered Meat Establishments (LRMEs) nationwide. This is undertaken in coordination with the National Meat Inspection Service (NMIS) and the Local Government Units (LGUs).

Concepts and Definitions

Backyard farm refers to any farm or household that tends/raises livestock and/or poultry animals.

Commercial farm refers to any livestock farm which satisfied at least one of the following conditions:

- Tending at least 21 heads of adult and zero head of young;
- Tending at least 41 heads of young animals; or
- Tending at least 10 heads of adult and 22 heads of young.

Deaths/Losses refer to the number of animals that died due to pests, diseases, and calamities.

Farmgate price refers to the price received by raisers for their produce at the location of farm. Thus, the marketing costs, such as the transport and other marketing cost (if any) incurred in selling the produce, is not included in the farmgate prices.

Inventory refers to the actual number of domesticated animals present in the farm as of a specific reference date.

Imports refer to the number of live animals originating from foreign country, i.e., live breeders and feeders, recorded by the Bureau of Animal Industry – National Veterinary Quarantine Services (BAI-NVQS), while meat importation data are compiled by the Trade Statistics Division (TSD) of PSA from the copies of Import Entry and Internal Revenue Declaration collected from the Bureau of Customs (BOC).

Locally Registered Meat Establishment (LRME) refers to the slaughterhouses, meat processing plants, meat cutting plants, and cold storages that are allowed to operate by the city/municipal government but are not accredited by NMIS.

Slaughterhouse (SH) refers to the premises that are approved and registered by the NMIS and LGUs in which food animals are slaughtered for human consumption.

Slaughtered in slaughterhouses refers to the number of animals slaughtered in licensed to operate meat establishments (AAA, AA) including number of animals slaughtered in LRMEs.

Supply and disposition refers to a framework that explains the population dynamics of animals in the farm. This includes born live, imports, deaths and losses, number of animals slaughtered in the farm/household, and sold live for slaughter.

Value of production refers to the value of the animal with reference to its farmgate price. It is derived by multiplying the volume of production with its farmgate price.

Volume of production refers to the quantity of locally-raised animals disposed for slaughter which includes animals shipped out for slaughter. This can be expressed in number of head, or in thousand metric tons, liveweight.

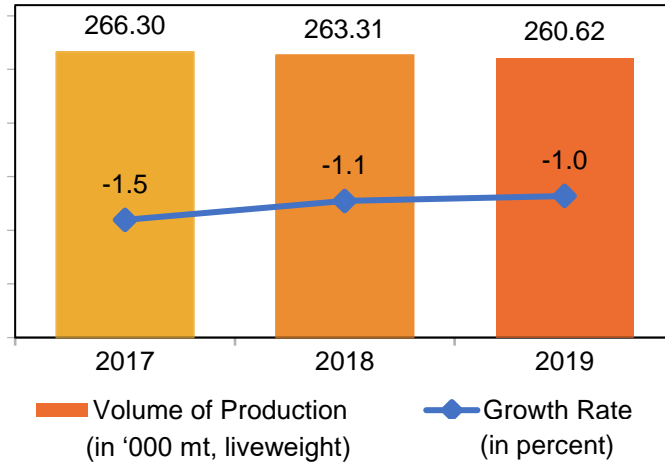

1. Volume of Production

a. National

January-December, 2017-2019^P



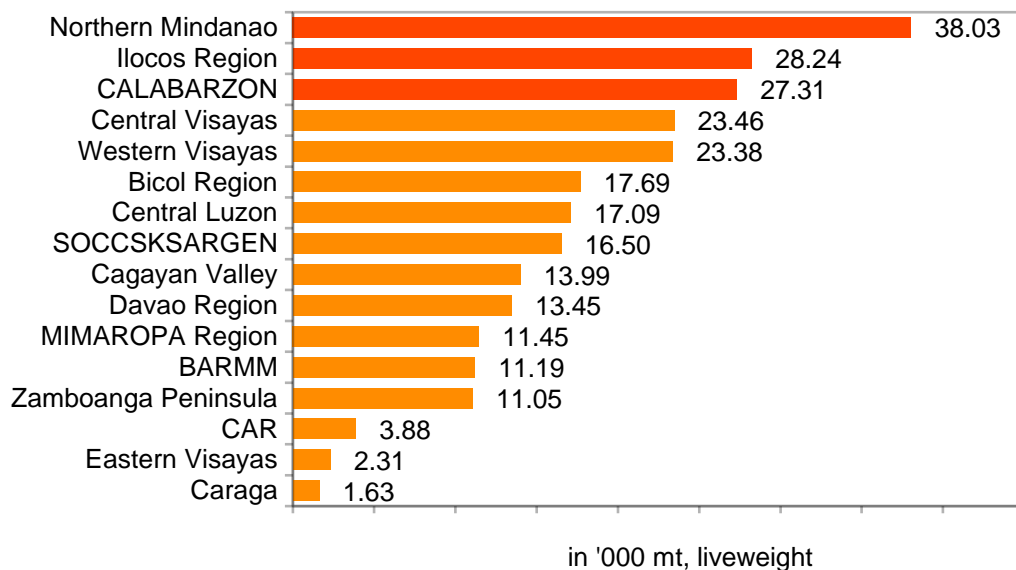

The total volume of cattle production in 2019 was estimated at 260.62 thousand metric tons, liveweight. This was -1.0 percent lower than the 263.31 thousand metric tons, liveweight output in 2018. (Figure 1, and Table 1)

b. Regional

January-December 2019^P

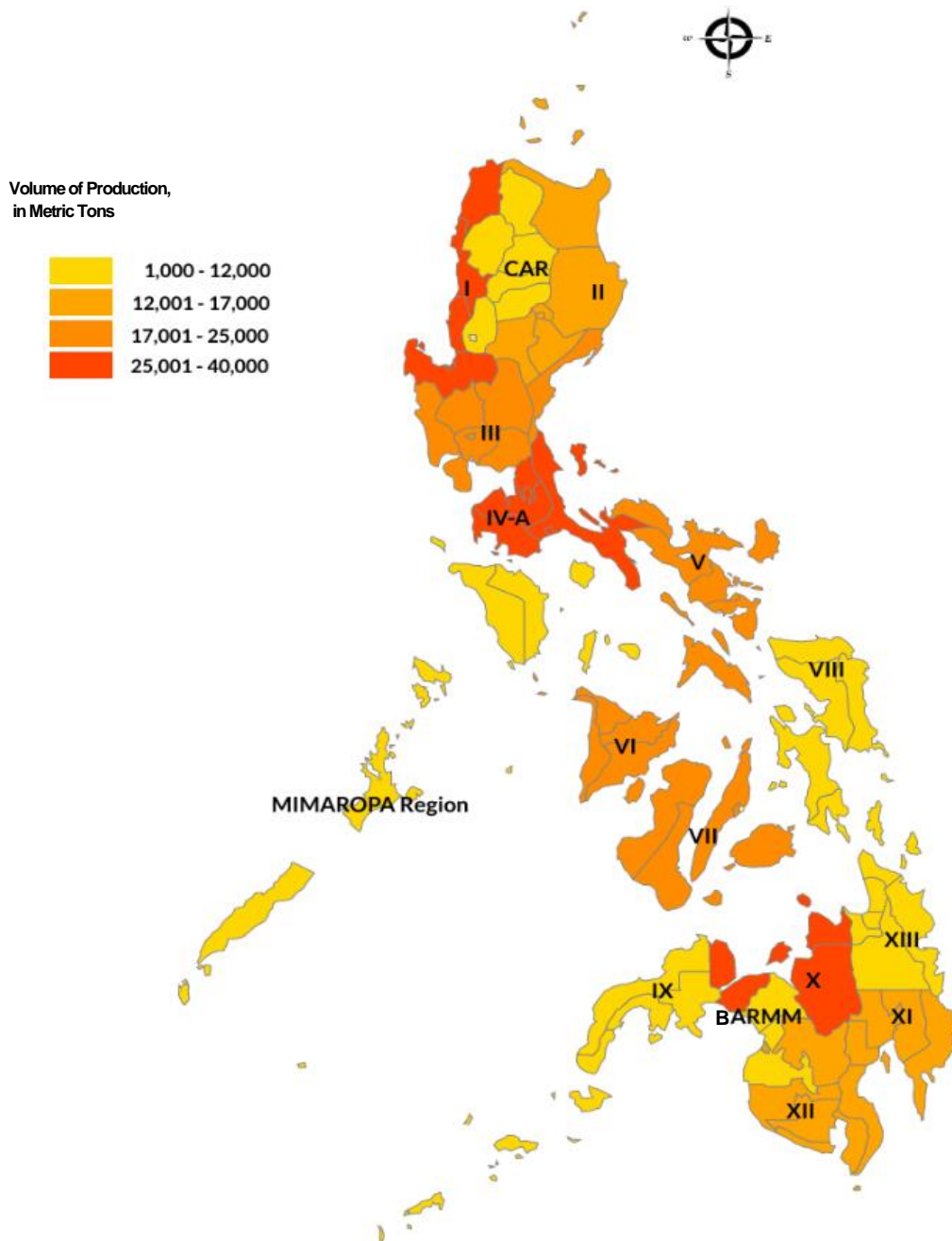

Among the regions, Northern Mindanao was the highest producer of cattle with 38.03 thousand metric tons, liveweight. This was followed by Ilocos Region and CALABARZON with corresponding productions of 28.24 thousand metric tons, liveweight and 27.31 thousand metric tons, liveweight. These three regions contributed 35.9 percent to the country's total cattle production. (Figure 2, and Table 2)

Philippines: January-December 2019^P

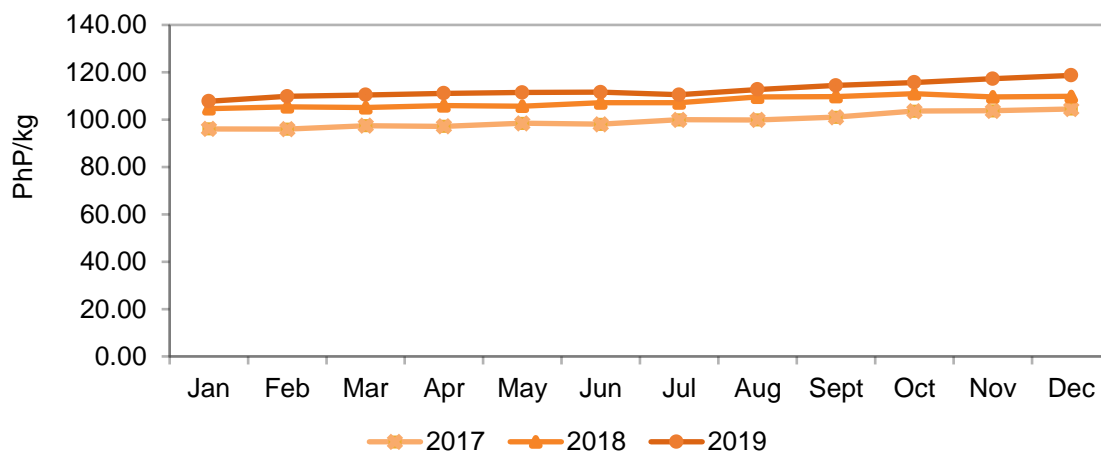

2. Prices

a. Farmgate Price

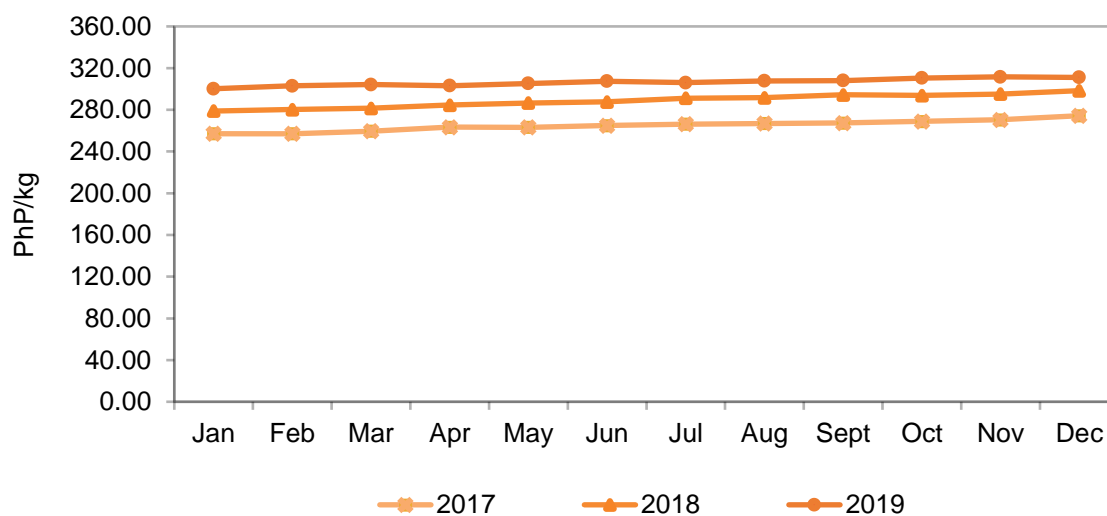

In 2019, the annual average farmgate price of cattle for slaughter was PhP 112.62 per kilogram, liveweight. This was 4.7 percent higher than the PhP 107.56 per kilogram, liveweight farmgate price in 2018.

The highest farmgate price was recorded in December at PhP 118.67 per kilogram, liveweight, while the lowest was in January at PhP 107.75 per kilogram, liveweight. (Figure 4, and Table 4)

b. Retail Price

The annual average retail price of beef, lean meat in 2019 was PhP 306.55 per kilogram. This was 6.2 percent higher compared with the PhP 288.69 per kilogram annual average retail price in 2018.

The highest retail price was recorded in November at PhP 311.66 per kilogram and the lowest was in January at PhP 300.22 per kilogram. (Figure 5, and Table 5)

3. Value of Production

At current prices, the gross value of cattle production in 2019 was estimated at PhP 29.69 billion or 3.6 percent higher than the PhP 28.65 billion gross receipt in 2018.

At constant prices, the gross value of production contracted to PhP 28.35 billion or by -1.0 percent in 2019, relative to the PhP 28.65 billion level in 2018. (Table 6)

4. Supply and Disposition

In 2019, the total supply of live cattle was 3,435.74 thousand heads. It inched up by 0.1 percent from the 3,434.05 thousand heads recorded in 2018. This was a result of the increase in cattles born live by 1.7 percent.

Total disposition during the year was 893.78 thousand heads. It was -0.5 percent lower than the level in the previous year of 898.64 thousand heads. From this total, cattles slaughtered declined by -0.4 percent while deaths, and losses went down by -8.4 percent. (Table 7)

5. Imports

In 2019, the total volume of imported beef was recorded at 101.65 thousand metric tons or an increase of 3.0 percent from the 98.73 thousand metric tons recorded in the previous year. Importation of beef was highest during the first quarter of the year which increased substantially by 27.7 percent or by 5.75 thousand metric tons from the 2018 record. (Table 8)
