

The **System of National Accounts (SNA)** is an internationally agreed standard set of recommendations on how to compile measures of economic activity in accordance with strict accounting conventions based on economic principles.

The PSA Board has approved the General Policy on the Revision and Rebasing of the Philippine System of National Accounts through the **PSA Board Resoluton No. 11, Series of 2018**. Further, it was proposed that the revision and rebasing of PSNA will be done every ten (10) years after the release of the next release in 2020.
