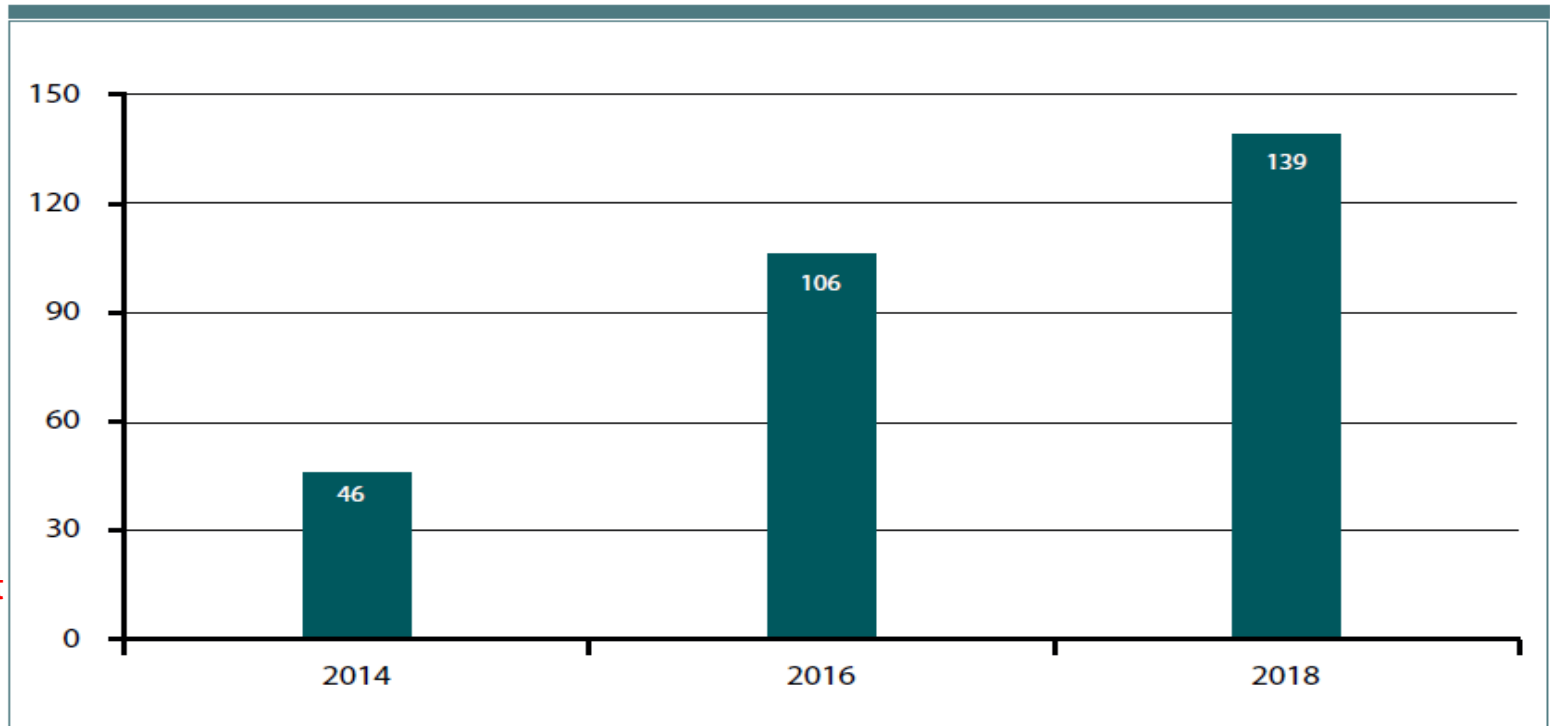

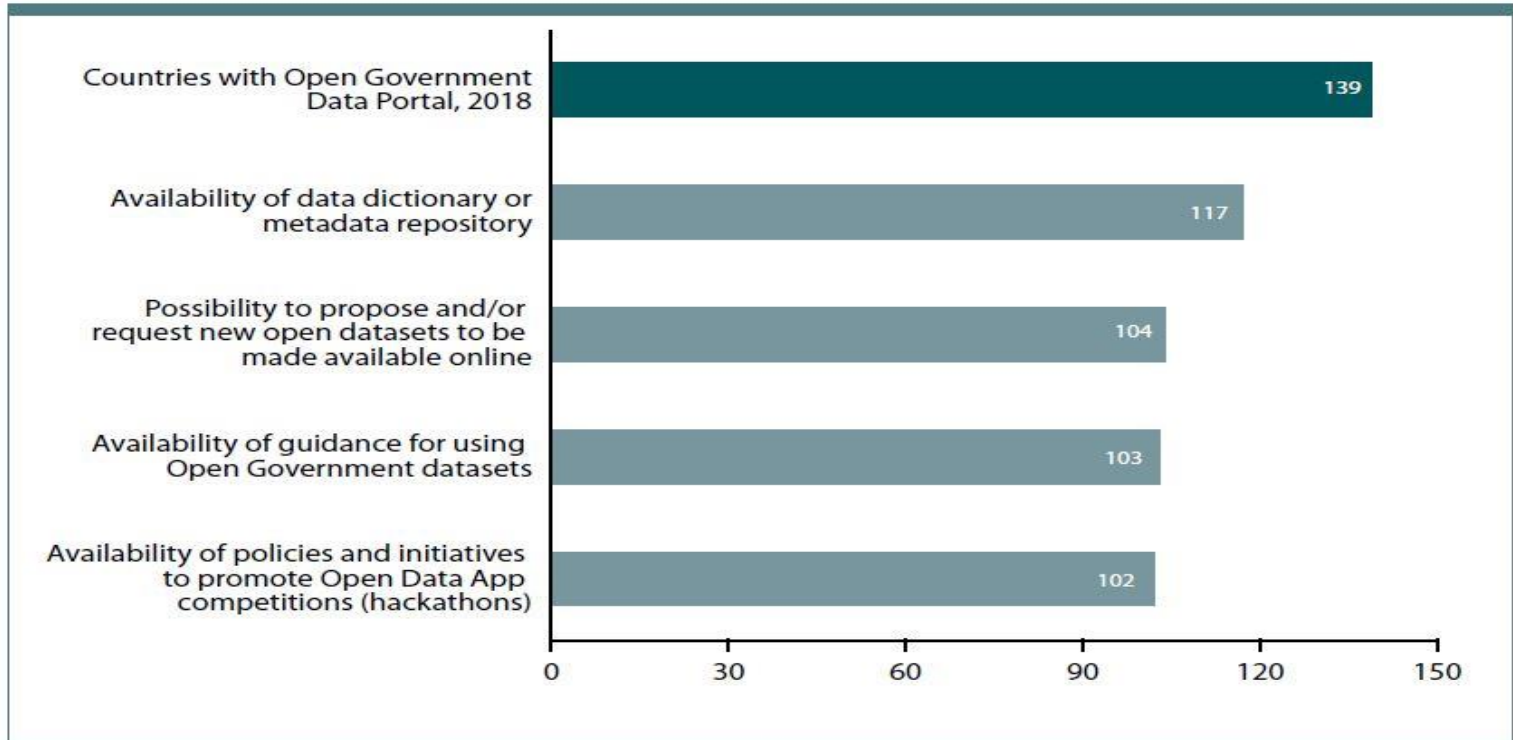
Countries with Open Data Portal in 2014, 2016, and 2018

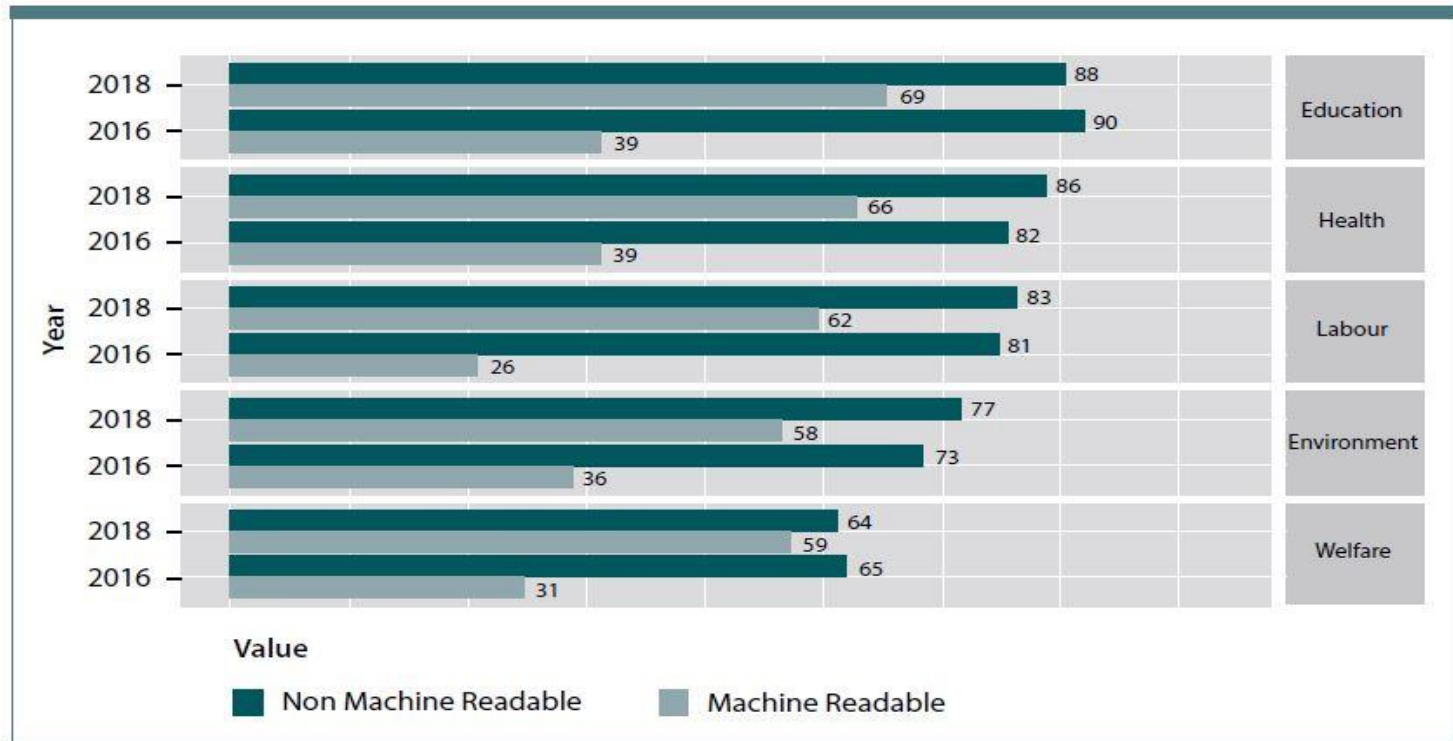
Functionalities of Open Data Portals, 2018

- **EO No. 43 s. 2011 (Section 2)**

- To institutionalize, open, transparent, accountable, and inclusive governance;

- **Data Privacy Act of 2012 (Section 2)**

- To ensure free flow of information to promote innovation and growth;

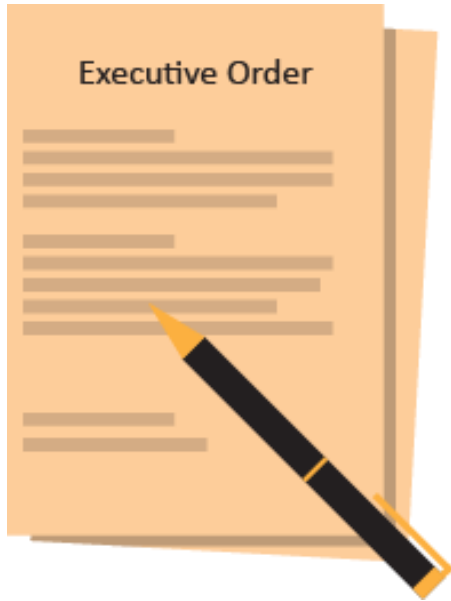
- **JMC No. 2014-01**

- Formalized the **Task Force** to lead ODPH

- **JMC No. 2015-01**

- Guidelines on the Open Government Data Provision in the 2015 General Appropriations Act (GAA)

Policies



- **Republic Act 10844**

- Created the Department of Information and Communications Technology;

In 2017, the management of the ODPH website was transferred from DBM to DICT;

In 2018, ODPH was integrated into **gov.ph**

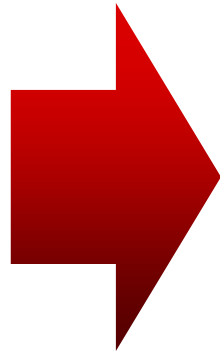
