BACKGROUND

Currently accounts for 8.2 % of the population.

When will the Philippines reach the "aging population"?

"Once a country reaches 14 percent (senior citizens) of the population then it is an aging society and we will hit 14 percent between 2030 and 2035."



As the country is moving toward an "aging" population, and to address the growing elderly population, there is a need to develop policies and to strengthen Geriatric Programs.

"Expanded Senior Citizens Act of 2010"

Republic Act No. 9994

AN ACT GRANTING ADDITIONAL BENEFITS AND PRIVILEGES TO SENIOR CITIZENS, FURTHER AMENDING REPUBLIC ACT NO. 7432, AS AMENDED, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS "AN ACT TO MAXIMIZE THE CONTRIBUTION OF SENIOR CITIZENS TO NATION BUILDING, GRANT BENEFITS AND SPECIAL PRIVILEGES AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES"

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

Section 1. Title. - This Act Shall be known as the "Expanded Senior Citizens Act of 2010."

Sec. 5C

"Throughout the country, there shall be established a "senior citizens' ward" in every government hospital. This geriatric ward shall be for the exclusive use of senior citizens who are in need of hospital confinement by reason of their health conditions."

- To assess the accessibility of the geriatric services of the government hospitals







% of Senior Citizens admitted




Total inpatient: 2,610,608

Common reasons for unavailability of Geriatric Ward

- No available space for a geriatric ward
- Due to space constraint, senior citizens are admitted in general and private wards
- Limited beds, the geriatric patients are mixed with other IM patients
- Beyond the service capability of the hospital
- No available funds/resources
- No specialist/gerontologist in the hospital yet
- The facility think they are not required

CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATION

- RA 9994 "Expanded Senior Citizens Act of 2010" is not fully implemented
- The findings of the study serve as basis for policy recommendations to improve the accessibility of senior citizens to health services and basis on the standard design development of geriatric ward.
- The government should advocate, focus on and develop further the geriatric services and facilities in the country to improve the availability and access for the senior citizens.
- Need to invest, produce and capacitate human resources for health in geriatric medicine and gerontology.
- Establish monitoring mechanism in the utilization of health facilities and services of the senior citizens, in coordination with Senior Citizen Commission.
