





2017 Open Data Inventory Annual Report

"In ODIN 2017, the Philippines' score increased by 14 points and their openness score increased by 32 points. Their new portal encompasses most of ODIN's five openness criteria, including making data available for export in machine readable and nonproprietary formats and through bulk download. Currently the data portal hosts 99 datasets under a single terms of use license. The portal boasts some impressive features, including an API. However, there is room to improve, including making its terms of use fully open and adding data selection options for non-technical users prior to exporting data."
