
Health Spending Grew by 10.9 Percent in 2019



The country's Current Health Expenditure (CHE) reached PhP 792.6 billion in 2019, 10.9 percent higher compared to PhP 714.8 billion in 2018. (Tables 1, and 2)

The Total Health Expenditure (THE), which comprises of CHE (87.5%) and Health Capital Formation Expenditure (12.5%), recorded PhP 906.0 billion in 2019, up by 7.9 percent from PhP 839.7 billion in 2018. As a result, the share of THE to the Gross Domestic Product (GDP) at current prices was 4.6 percent. (Tables 37 to 40)



Household-out-of-pocket payment (OOP) remains the largest among sources of health financing in the country, amounting to PhP 379.7 billion or 47.9 percent of CHE in 2019. Health spending financed through government schemes and compulsory contributory health care financing schemes came second at PhP 332.8 billion with 42.0 percent share. Meanwhile, voluntary health care payment schemes contributed PhP 80.0 billion or 10.1 percent share. (Tables 10, and 12)

Among the health providers, bulk of CHE were spent on *hospitals* (43.6%), amounting to PhP 345.5 billion. It was followed by *pharmacies* (30.3%) with PhP 239.8 billion, while the *providers of health care system administration and financing* (7.4%) accounted for PhP 58.9 billion. (Tables 13, and 15)

On a per capita basis, health spending was at PhP 6,662.2 in 2019, up by 7.4 percent compared to PhP 6,200.3 in 2018. (Tables 43, and 44)
