She provided an overview of the Community-Based Monitoring System (CBMS) and its potential for informing the development of appropriate policies and interventions to enhance Local Economic Development. Various successful applications of the CBMS in different local government units (LGUs) were highlighted to inspire a commitment to promoting adaptive and inclusive local governance among the participants. During the course, the participants gained valuable knowledge and a deeper appreciation for concepts, principles, and methodologies related to leadership, adaptive and inclusive governance, and evidence-based policy development.
