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Extent of Unionism and Collective Bargaining in Establishments: 2016

(First of a series on Industrial Relations Practices)

The 2015/2016 Integrated Survey on Labor and Employment (ISLE) is one of the regular establishment-based surveys of the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) which is conducted every two (2) years. The survey covered a total of 12,926 agricultural and non-agricultural establishments employing 20 or more workers nationwide. The main objective of the survey is to generate integrated data sets on employment of specific groups of workers; occupational shortages and surpluses; training of workers; productivity-based incentive schemes; occupational safety and health practices; and occupational injuries and diseases. These data are valuable inputs to studies on industry trends and practices and serve as bases for the formulation of policies on employment, conditions of work and industrial relations. To some extent, the survey results will also be used to assess the progress of decent work in the country.

This series of LABSTAT Updates highlights the results of the module on Industrial Relations Practices of the 2015/2016 Integrated Survey on Labor and Employment (ISLE). This issue specifically focuses on the extent of unionism and collective bargaining in 2016.

Data on unionism and collective bargaining as cited in this report are based on estimates and are therefore not comparable with other published statistics based on administrative reports.

EXTENT OF UNIONISM

Share of total establishments with unions increased in 2016

- Survey results showed that 6.7 percent or 2,099 establishments out of the total estimated 31,277 establishments with 20 or more workers had unions in 2016. The figure indicated a marginal increase of almost 1.0 percentage point relative to the 5.8 percent share in 2014. (Table 1).
- In proportion to respective total establishments, electricity, steam and air conditioning supply industry had the most organized 34.1 aroup percent. at Establishments engaged in water supply, sewerage, waste management and remediation came next at 23.1 percent. The least organized groups were in those establishments that were engaged administrative support and service activities 0.6 at only



- As to type of ownership, 18.2 percent (137 out of 753) of multinational establishments had unions. The shares were relatively lower for joint ventures (7.6%) and foreign-owned establishments (6.7%). Filipino-owned establishments posted the lowest share at 6.4 percent.
- By employment size, establishments with 200 or more workers had the most number of unions at 18.2 percent. This was followed by establishments with 100–199 workers (9.9%) and those with 20-99 workers (4.2%).

Union density rate declined to 6.5 percent in 2016

 About 283,081 of the 4.365 million paid employees in 2016

- were members of union for a **union density rate** or proportion of union membership to total paid employees of 6.5 percent. The union density rate in 2016 declined by 1.2 percentage points from 7.7 percent in 2014. (Table 1)
- A decline was likewise posted in non-agricultural establishments as union density rate went down to 6.0 percent from 7.4 percent in 2014. (Table 3)
- Relatively high union density rates were observed in electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply (27.9%); mining and quarrying (24.0%) and water supply, sewerage, waste management and remediation activities (23.1%). (Figure 1)

- Joint venture establishments as having the most organized groups, with a union density rate of 8.7 percent. Multinational corporations Filipino-owned establishments followed with 7.3 percent and 7.0 percent, respectively. Foreignowned establishments had the lowest at 3.3 percent.
- Establishments employing 200 or workers registered the highest union density rate at 8.0 percent. lower rate of 5.3 Α percent followed for 100-199 establishments with workers while those with 20-99 workers had the least share of 2.9 percent.


EXTENT OF COLLECTIVE BARGAINING

Almost all establishments with unions had CBAs

- Almost all the unionized establishments or 97.1 percent (2,038 out of 2,099) were covered by CBAs in 2016. In proportion to total establishments however, merely 6.5 percent (2,038 out of 31,277) had CBAs, higher by 1 percentage point from 5.5 percent reported in 2014. (Table 1)
- Remarkably, all reported establishments with unions had negotiated their respective CBAs in the following seven (7) industries: mining and quarrying; information and communication; real estate activities; professional, scientific technical activities: administrative and support service activities; arts, entertainment and recreation; and repair of computers and personal and household goods, and other personal service activities. (Table 2)

CBA coverage rate went down to 7.2 percent in 2016

- With a CBA coverage rate of 7.2 percent computed as the proportion of employees covered by CBAs to total paid employees, an equivalent of 313,267 workers out of the total 4.365 million paid employees were covered by CBAs in 2016. The CBA coverage rate decreased by 0.9 percentage point from the 8.1 percent reported in 2014. (Table 1)
- Across industries, electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply registered the highest coverage rate at 28.9 percent followed by mining and quarrying and water supply, sewerage, waste management and remediation activities at 25.3 percent and 25.1 respectively. percent, administrative and support service activities posted the lowest CBA coverage rate at 0.1 percent. (Figure 2)



- As to type of ownership, highest CBA coverage rate was observed in joint venture establishments (9.6%) followed by multinational establishments (8.2%). Foreignowned establishments had the least share at 3.4 percent. (Table 3)
- By employment size, establishments with 200 or more workers posted the largest coverage rate of 8.8 percent. The lowest share was reported in establishments with 20-99 workers.

EXTENT OF WOMEN'S PARTICIPATION IN UNIONISM AND COLLECTIVE BARGAINING

Women comprised a little over onethird of total union members

- Of the total 283,081 union members in 2016, 35.0 percent were women. (Table 4)
- By major industry group, а predominance of women union members was reported the in following industries: financial and insurance activities (64.4%); human

health and social work activities except public health activities (58.2%); and education except public education (57.5%).

17.8 percent of the total union leadership were women

- About one out of every 5 union presidents (17.8% or 408 out of 2,293 union presidents) were women. A relatively larger proportion unions in the following industries were headed by women: arts, entertainment and recreation (47.1%);education except public education (38.5%); and professional, and technical scientific activities (35.0%).
- Of the total 23,135 union officers, only a little over one-fifth (21.4%) were women. Almost half or 48.1 percent of union officers in arts, entertainment and recreation industry were women. The rest of the industries were still dominated by men.
