# WAGE RATES OF PLANT AND MACHINE OPERATORS AND ASSEMBLERS IN SELECTED MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES 

(17th of an 18-Part Series on 2006 OWS)

This issue of the LABSTAT Updates on the results of the 2006 Occupational Wages Survey (OWS) focuses on the wage rates of 31 categories of plant and machine operators and assemblers in 18 industry groups of manufacturing.

The wage rates of 169 occupations across 45 industry groups were covered in the OWS. These are posted on the BLES website.

Chemical-filtering and separating equipment operators in manufacture of coke, petroleum and other fuel products recorded highest average wage rate among selected plant and machine operators
 the manufacture of coke, refined petroleum and other fuel products
> pharmaceutical and toiletry products machine operators $(P 16,571)$ in the manufacture of chemicals and chemical products
$>$ petroleum refining plant operators (P14,468) in the manufacture of coke, refined petroleum and other fuel products
$>$ food and related products machine operators ( $\mathrm{P} 11,943$ ) in the manufacture of food products and beverages
> coke production plant operators ( $\mathrm{P} 11,130$ ) in the manufacture of coke, refined petroleum and other fuel products.

In contrast, low average wage rates were noted in the manufacture of wood and wood products except furniture for:
$>$ wood products machine operators (P6,755)
> wood and related products assemblers (P6,421).

Wage rates of the rest of plant and machine operators and assemblers ranged from P7,061 to P10,552.

## Definition of Terms:

o Wage rate refers to the sum of basic pay and regular/guaranteed cash allowances.
o Basic pay refers to pay for normal/regular working time before deductions for employees' social security contributions and withholding taxes. It excludes overtime, night shift differential and other premium pay; commissions, tips and share of employees in service charge; and payment in kind.
o Allowances refer to regular/guaranteed cash payments. These include living allowance but exclude reimbursements for travel, entertainment, meals and other expenses, etc. incurred in conducting the business of the employer; cost of uniform/working clothes; bonuses and gratuities; family allowances.
