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# SURVEY OF J OB VACANCI ES <br> I N LARGE ENTERPRISES IN METRO MANI LA <br> First Quarter 2009 

## OVERVIEW

This issue presents statistics on job vacancies in large enterprises based in Metro Manila for the first quarter of 2009. Said statistics were gathered from the results of the Labor Turnover Survey (LTS) conducted by the Bureau of Labor and Employment Statistics (BLES) for that period.

The LTS covered around 700 respondents that were drawn from the 2007 List of Top 8,000 Corporations in the Philippines as compiled by the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC). Considered as industry trend setters, firms covered by the LTS provide timely signals on labor demand in the formal sector of the economy.

This report attempts to capture the distribution of labor demand by type of occupations/skills in the enterprises covered by the survey. Statistics from this report were based on sample data.

## SURVEY RESULTS

Two (2) of every five (5) sample enterprises have job openings

- Of the 681 enterprise respondents, $40.8 \%$ or 278 were actively recruiting applicants to fill up vacancies in their organizations during the first quarter of 2009.


More than 9,000 job openings available for placement

- A total of 9,027 jobs in various types of occupations and skills were open for qualified applicants.
- The bulk $(4,038$ or $44.7 \%)$ of the job openings were dominated by vacancies coming from the real estate, renting and business activities sub-sector particularly those engaged in business process outsourcing (BPO). Fairly large numbers were also reported in hotels and restaurants ( 1,618 or $17.9 \%$ ) and financial intermediation (1,250 or $13.8 \%$ ).
- Relatively few job openings were reported in manufacturing (279) and wholesale and retail trade (458) - two sub-sectors which traditionally accounted for the bulk of the job vacancies.


## Service support workers and sales workers on top of the vacancy list

- The top ten occupations in terms of the number of vacant positions were dominated by service support workers of various types, sales workers, computer professionals and carpenters. Together, they accounted for nearly two-thirds (63.4\%) of the total vacant positions offered by employers during the reference period.
