SURVEY OF JOB VACANCIES IN LARGE ENTERPRISES IN METRO MANILA Second Quarter 2009

OVERVIEW

This issue presents statistics on job vacancies in large enterprises based in Metro Manila for the second quarter of 2009. Said statistics were gathered from the results of the Labor Turnover Survey (LTS) conducted by the Bureau of Labor and Employment Statistics (BLES) for that period.

The LTS covered around 700 respondents that were drawn from the 2007 List of Top 8,000 Corporations in the Philippines as compiled by the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC). Considered as industry trend setters, firms covered by the LTS provide timely signals on labor demand in the formal sector of the economy.

This report attempts to capture the distribution of labor demand by type of occupations/skills in the enterprises covered by the survey. Statistics from this report were based on sample data.

SURVEY RESULTS

Almost half of sample enterprises are hiring

 More than forty-five percent (45.2%) or 308 out of 682 enterprises were searching for qualified jobseekers during the second quarter of 2009, an increase from the first quarter percentage of 40.8%.



More than 3,500 vacancies available for placement

- Overall, there were 3,737 available jobs in various types of occupations and skills. These were fewer than the first quarter vacancies probably because the previous openings had already been filled up (e.g., healthcare customer service associate with 2,000 available positions). Moreover, the accession rate this quarter, which stood at 9.7%, was higher than the 9.3% of the first quarter.
- Almost half of the job openings (1,836 or 49.1%) came from enterprises engaged in financial intermediation (771 or 20.6%); mining and quarrying (538 or 14.4%); and real estate, renting and business activities (527 or 14.1%).
- Enterprises engaged in wholesale and retail trade, and hotels and restaurants came in fourth and fifth spots with 410 (11.0%) and 382 vacancies (10.2%), respectively.

Demand for service crew on the rise

The top ten occupations with the number most οf vacancies accounted for 34.7% of the total job openings for the second 2009. These quarter of occupations were dominated by service crew, development drilling workers, cashiers, clerks and IT officers.
