SURVEY OF JOB VACANCIES IN LARGE ENTERPRISES IN METRO MANILA Third Quarter 2009



OVERVIEW

This issue presents statistics on job vacancies in large enterprises based in Metro Manila for the third quarter of 2009. Data were culled from the results of the Labor Turnover Survey (LTS) conducted by the Bureau of Labor and Employment Statistics (BLES) for that period.

The LTS covered about 700 respondents that were drawn from the 2007 List of Top 8,000 Corporations in the Philippines as compiled by the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC). Considered as industry trendsetters, firms covered by the LTS provide timely signals on labor demand in the formal sector of the economy.

This report attempts to capture the distribution of labor demand by type of occupations/skills in the enterprises covered by the survey. Statistics from this report were based on sample data.

SURVEY RESULTS

Forty-four percent of sample enterprises have job openings

 Three hundred thirteen (313) out of 705 establishments posted job openings. They accounted for 44.4% of the total number of surveyed enterprises for the third quarter of 2009.

Close to 5,000 vacancies ready for placement

- A total of 4,852 positions in various occupational groups were available for placement. Vacancies went up by almost 30% during the third quarter compared with the previous quarter (4,852 vs. 3,737).
- The services sector had the most number of job openings as its subsectors occupied the top four spots. Real estate, renting and business activities ranked first

- with 1,277 vacancies (26.3%). It was followed by financial intermediation (928 or 19.1%); wholesale and retail trade (778 or 16.0%); hotels and restaurants (432 or 8.9%); and construction (347 or 7.2%).
- Fishing had the fewest number of job openings across the subsectors with 31 vacant positions (0.6%). It was followed by private education (70 or 1.4%).

Customer service representatives top the vacancy roll

• Compared with second quarter 2009, the demand for customer service representatives tripled (477 vs. 153), outnumbering cashiers and customer sales representatives. The top ten occupations with the most number of job openings captured 37.4% of the total job openings for the third quarter of 2009. These vacant positions also included junior new accounts tellers, service crew, medical representatives, sales people and clerks.
