HIGHLIGHTS OF THE JULY 2011 LABOR FORCE SURVEY



Overview

Employment continued to expand (2.4%) in July 2011 as growth in industry (4.1%) and services (4.3%) outpaced previous year's growth records - offsetting the slight decline (-1.2%) in agriculture, fishery and forestry. The quality of employment improved with robust growth in wage employment (7.9%) and full-time employment (3.0%) while vulnerable employment fell (-2.5 percentage points).

Unemployment rate stood at 7.1% - upped marginally by 0.1 percentage point from 7.0% in July 2010 - as labor force participation rate (LFPR) rose by 0.4 percentage point to 64.3%. On the downside, underemployment rate at 19.1% was up by 1.2 percentage points from a year ago but visible underemployment rate was about unchanged at 11.0%.

Labor Force

The country's labor force grew year-on-year by 2.5% (+982,000) in July 2011 to reach 39.928 million. This figure corresponds to a labor force participation rate (LFPR) of 64.3%, upped by 0.4 percentage point from the same period in 2010. *(Table 1)*

Employment

Employment level grew by 2.4% in July 2011. Total employed persons increased to 37.107 million from 36.237 million a year ago - a net addition or new employment creation of nearly а million (+870,000). The latest growth figure represents an improvement from last growth vear's rate of 2.1% (+729,000). (Table 2)

 Services sector's employment grew the fastest at 4.3 (+794,000) – a marked improvement from 1.6% (+291,000) growth recorded in

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persons (+131,000); hotels and restaurants (+125,000);transport, storage and communications (+100,000); and public administration and defense, compulsory social security (+74,000). Meanwhile, employment losses were posted education (-12,000)in and financial intermediation (-1,000).

- Industry employment also grew faster this year at 4.1% (+223,000) compared with 2.6% (+135,000) a year ago. The growth biggest occurred in construction (+101,000) followed manufacturing (+72,000);by electricity, gas and water (+38,000);mining and and quarrying (+11,000).
- Meanwhile, employment in agriculture, fishery and forestry sector was down slightly by 1.2% (-147,000) compared with the same period last year due to occurrence of strong typhoons in July.
- The quality of employment improved. Wage and salarv employment grew by a robust 7.9% (+1.532 million); full-time employment rose by 3.0% (+697,000); and the mean hours of work remained the same at 41.8.

Meanwhile, the proportion of employment (selfvulnerable persons + employed unpaid family workers) to total employed fell from 42.7% to 40.2% over the period while part-time employment grew marginally by 0.8% (+97,000).

 Employment rose in all but one region. The biggest gain was posted in Region X (+108,000) followed by Region VI (+93,000), and NCR (+71,000). Region V was the only region that suffered losses in employment (-15,000).

Underemployment

- Underemployment rate was up from 17.9% to 19.1%. This translates to 7.095 million underemployed persons, an increase of 593,000 from a year ago level. (*Table 3*)
- On the positive note, it should be observed that visible underemployment rate – which is a more objective measure of underutilization of labor – was about unchanged during the same period (from 10.7% to 11.0% or +193,000).

Unemployment

With more persons joining the labor market this period, the number of unemployed persons increased by 113,000 to 2.822 million in July 2011. This translates to unemployment rate of 7.1% - a marginal increase of 0.1% from last year's figure of 7.0%.

- Half (53.1% or 1.498 million) of the total unemployed workforce were young workers (aged 15 to 24 years old). Youth unemployment rate at 17.9% was more than twice the national average. This rate was 0.6 percentage point higher than last year. (Table 4)
- There were more unemployed male (1.766 million) than female (1.056 million).
- The majority (44.1% or 1.245 million) were high school graduates or undergraduates. Equally large were college undergraduates and graduates (42.6% or 1.202 million).

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- Five (5) regions posted unemployment rates higher than the national rate: NCR (10.9%), Region I (7.9%), Region III (9.6%) and Region IV-A (10.4%). The lowest were posted in Region II (2.4%), Region IX (3.3%), and ARMM (3.7%). (Table 5)
- Compared with last year, notable increase in unemployment rates occurred in Region III (+1.3 percentage points), Region X (+1.2 percentage points), and Region IV-A (+1.0 percentage point). On the other hand, only Region II posted a notable reduction in rate (-1.5 percentage points).
