... Cases of Occupational Diseases (Last of a Four-part Series)

This series of LABSTAT Updates present statistical briefs on cases of occupational injuries and diseases that affected workers in private sector establishments in 2009. The statistics were based on the results of the 2009/2010 BLES Integrated Survey (BITS) conducted in 2010 by the Bureau of Labor and Employment Statistics (BLES) in coordination with the DOLE Regional Offices.

The BITS is a nationwide survey covering 6,780 non-agricultural establishments with 20 or more workers in 65 industry groups. It also generates statistics on employment of specific groups of workers; occupational shortages and surpluses; practices on balancing work and family responsibilities; working time arrangements; and occupational safety and health practices that can be used as basis for policy and program formulation and evaluation.

Specifically, this fourth issue discusses the results of the survey regarding the number and types of occupational diseases by industry in 2009. The metadata and the statistical tables of the survey are posted on the BLES website. (The earlier series of LABSTAT Updates on occupational injuries and diseases were entitled "Are our workplaces safe?")


Manufacturing industry had the highest cases of occupational diseases

- In the inquiry on Occupational Injuries and Diseases of the 2009/2010 BITS, occupational disease is defined as an abnormal condition or disorder other than one resulting from an occupational injury caused by exposure over a period of time to risk factors associated with work activity such contact with certain as chemicals, inhaling coal dust, carrying out repetitive movements, etc.
- In 2009, a total of 71,894 cases of occupational diseases were reported in non-agricultural establishments employing 20 or more workers. (*Table 1*)

- Manufacturing industry accounted for the biggest share of occupational diseases at 47.4%. (*Figure 1*)
- Far second was real estate, renting and business activities which posted 9.9% of the total cases of occupational diseases.
- Transport, storage and communications; and electricity, gas and water supply made up 8.1% and 7.0% of total, respectively.
- On the other hand, hotels and restaurants reported the lowest share of occupational diseases at 1.8%.






Back pain, most common type of occupational disease

- Back pain was the most common type of occupational disease among workers in covered establishments. It accounted for 22.9% of the total cases of occupational diseases. (*Figure 2*)
- This type of disease was prevalent in manufacturing industry which posted 46.5% (7,659 cases) of the total cases of back pains. (*Table 1*)
- Transport, storage and communications followed with a share of 16.5%.
- Other industry group had shares ranging from 0.4% (construction) to 8.4% (private education services).

- Other types of diseases which were included in the category "Others" (e.g., urinary tract infection, upper respiratory tract infection, etc.) registered the second highest type of diseases at 12.9%.
- Other common types of occupational diseases were: essential hypertension (12.7%); peptic ulcer (8.2%); occupational dermatitis (7.9%); other work-related musculoskeletal diseases (7.2%); occupational asthma (6.8%); and neck-shoulder pain (5.9%).
- The rest of the types of occupational diseases had shares of less than 5.0% with the lowest in chilblain, frostbite, freezing at 0.1%.



Definition of Terms:

For purposes of the survey, the following diseases were classified as:

Occupational dermatitis - including skin conditions due to chemical agents which are skin irritants and sensitizers.

Occupational asthma - due to exposure to allergenic particles in the working environment.

Acute poisonings - due to exposure to toxic chemical substances.

Heat stroke, cramps, exhaustion - due to exposure to excessive heat.

Chilblain, frostbite, freezing - due to exposure to excessive cold.

Deafness - loss of or decreased hearing due to excessive exposure to noise.

Tuberculosis - infections due to mycobacterium tuberculosis.

Other Infections - due to exposure to biologic hazards/agents, ex. anthrax, brucellosis, leptospirosis, tetanus, ornithosis, rabies, viral encephalitis, viral hemorrhagic fevers, hepatitis A, B, C, D, HIV, mycoses, protozoal and parasitic diseases.

Cataract - due to exposure to glare of or rays from molten glass or red hot metal.

Cardio-vascular diseases - cardiac injury or acute attack precipitated by unusual strains of work.

Essential hypertension - primary hypertension that causes impairment of function of kidneys, ears, eyes and brain resulting in permanent disability.

Peptic ulcer - due to prolonged emotional or physical stress at work.

- Work-related musculoskeletal disorders caused or made worst by work such as exposure to forceful exertions, highly repetitive motions, awkward body postures, vibrations, etc.
 - **Carpal tunnel syndrome** tingling, numbness or pain in wrist and hand from compression of the median nerve at the wrist area due to repetitive or forceful hand movement.
 - **Shoulder tendinitis** inflammation of the tendon affecting the shoulder joint due to use, overuse and pressure.
 - **Neck-shoulder pain** affecting the bones, joints, connective tissue, muscles and nerves of the cervical area.
 - **Back pain** affecting the bones, joints, connective tissues, muscles and nerves at the lumbar or sacral regions but not due to trauma.
