### 2014 SURVEY OF EMPLOYMENT IN ESTABLISHMENTS WITH 20 OR MORE WORKERS

### STATISTICS ON AGENCY-HIRED WORKERS

(Second of a series)

This LABSTAT Updates is based on the results of the 2013/2014 Integrated Survey on Labor and Employment (ISLE). The ISLE is a nationwide sample survey covering 8,399 establishments with at least 20 workers. This issue presents statistics on the employment of agency-hired workers as another form of contingent work arrangements resorted to by some firms to complement their workforce. Specifically, it presents statistics on: (1) the extent to which firms or establishments across industry groups resort to agency-hired workers to augment their workforce; and (2) the types of jobs/services outsourced by firms to manpower agencies.

Agency-hired workers refer to workers hired through contractors. In the 2013/2014 ISLE, they are defined as "workers employed by contractors to perform or complete a job, work or service pursuant to a service agreement within the premises of the establishment". They are excluded from the establishment's total employment.

The metadata and statistical tables of the survey are posted at the PSA website.

The hiring of workers through intermediaries or manpower agencies by establishments has grown in recent years. This practice has evolved into various forms of services - a departure from its traditional role of providing mainly security and janitorial services. Today, manpower agencies offer a wide range of services that encompass not only non-core activities of firms.

# Three out of every five establishments had agency-hired workers

Of the estimated 35,214 establishments with at least 20 workers in June 2014, three out of every five (61.5% or 21,650) engaged the services of agencyhired workers. (Table 1)

Across industry groups, private health and social work activities posted the highest proportion of establishments with agencyhired workers (81.0%). This was followed by electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply (73.7%);arts, entertainment and recreation (71.8%);water supply, sewerage, waste management remediation and activities (70.0%);manufacturing (69.6%); and financial and insurance activities (68.6%).

The lowest proportions were observed in repair of computers and personal and household goods, and other personal service activities (26.5%); and administrative and support

service activities (31.1%). (Table 2)

## Manufacturing hired the largest number of agency workers

Based on the survey results, the number of agency-hired workers was recorded at 621,905 or 12.2% of the total 5.094 million persons engaged by the establishments on June 30, 2014.

- Among industries, the biggest number of agency-hired workers was noted in manufacturing at 244,538 or 39.3% of total agency-hired workers reported in 2014. This implies that two in every five agency-hired workers were engaged in manufacturing activities. (Table 3)
- Wholesale and retail trade ranked far second at 90,763 or 14.6% of total agency-hired workers.
- The rest were distributed across other industry groups, mostly in agriculture, forestry and fishing (7.1% or 43,955); accommodation and food service activities (7.0% or 43,354); and

- financial and insurance activities (5.4% or 33,781).
- Meanwhile, negligible proportions were noted in three industries, namely, repair of computers and personal and household goods, and other personal service activities (0.3% or 1,602); water supply, sewerage, waste management and remediation activities (0.5% 3,119); and or construction (1.0% or 6,500).

#### Agency-hired workers engaged by establishments mainly for security and janitorial services

- Agency workers were hired by most establishments primarily for security and janitorial services. Survey data showed that nearly two-fifths (36.8% or 228,886) of total agency-hired workers in 2014 were engaged for these services. (Table 3)
- This proportion varied across industries. For security services, high proportion was observed in financial and insurance activities (59.1%);water supply, sewerage, waste management remediation activities (47.1%); and private education (47.1%). For janitorial services, the highest proportion was reported in private health and social work activities (41.1%); and again in private education (33.7%).
- The next largest share of agency-hired workers were those engaged to carry out activities related to production/assembly which involved one-fourth (25.8% or 160,355) of the total reported workers hired through agencies.

This practice was particular to manufacturing industry but limited only to a small proportion (16.0%) of the total number of manufacturing establishments, i.e., 1,052 out of 6,562 establishments.

Other jobs/services contracted out that can be regarded as industry specific were: packaging (70.0%)and warehousing (44.8%)manufacturing; cashiering (65.3%)and marketing/sales activities (62.5%) in wholesale and retail trade: food service/catering (64.7%) in accommodation and food service activities; messengerial tasks (40.9%) in financial and insurance activities; IT services (25.9%) information and communication.

The rest of the agency-hired workers were involved in other services that were generally common across industries such as repair/maintenance, general administrative, human resource, finance and accounting, and medical and health services.
