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Extent of Unionism and Collective Bargaining in Establishments: 2014

(First of a three-part series on Industrial Relations Practices)

This series of LABSTAT Updates highlights the results of the module on Industrial Relations Practices of the 2013/2014 Integrated Survey on Labor and Employment (ISLE). It is comprised of three (3) issues, with this initial issue focusing on the extent of unionism and collective bargaining.

The ISLE formerly BLES Integrated Survey covered a total of 8,399 agricultural and non-agricultural establishments employing 20 or more workers nationwide. The main objective of the survey is to generate integrated data sets on employment of specific groups of workers; occupational shortages and surpluses; training of workers; productivity improvement and gainsharing practices; occupational safety and health practices; occupational injuries and diseases; and labor cost of employees. These data are valuable inputs in the formulation of policies on employment, conditions of work and industrial relations.

Data on unionism and collective bargaining cited in this report are based on estimates and are therefore not comparable with other published statistics based on administrative reports.

EXTENT OF UNIONISM

Total establishments with union declined to 5.8% in 2014 from 8.9% in 2012

- Results of the survey showed that 5.8% of establishments with 20 or more workers (2,059 out of 35,209) had union in 2014. The figure registered a decline of 3.1 percentage points from 8.9% in 2012. (Table 1)
- Correspondingly, the decline was brought about by the 3.3 percentage point decrease (from 9.0% in 2012 to 5.7% in 2014) in unionized establishments in the non-agricultural sector.
- Conversely, the agricultural sector showed a reverse trend as the share of establishments with union nearly doubled from 5.7% to 10.1% for the same period.

- In proportion to respective total establishments, electricity, steam and air conditioning supply industry was the most organized at 32.9%. It was followed by water supply, sewerage, waste and management remediation activities at 20.3%. Establishments engaged in real estate activities were the least organized at only 0.4%. (Table 2)
- As to type of ownership, 16.1% (156 out of 968) of multinational establishments had unions. The shares were relatively lower in joint venture (9.1%) and foreign-owned establishments (9.0%). Filipinoowned establishments posted the lowest at 5.2%.
- By employment size, 1 out of every 5 (19.2%) establishments with 200 or more workers had unions. It was far lower at 11.6% in establishments with 100-199 workers and only 2.9% in establishments with 20-99 workers.

Union density dropped to 7.7% in 2014

 About 340,370 of the 4.437 million paid employees in 2014 were members of union or a union



- **density rate** (proportion of union membership to total paid employees) of 7.7%. The figure dropped by 2.2 percentage points from 9.9% reported in 2012. (Table 1)
- A decline was likewise posted in non-agricultural establishments as union density rate went down to 7.4% from 9.3% during the period.
- Details by industry showed that relatively high union density rates were reported in electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply (26.8%); water supply, sewerage, waste management and remediation activities (23.6%) and transportation and storage (20.6%). (Table 3)
- Joint venture establishments emerged as the most organized with a union density rate of 11.7%. Filipino-owned establishments and multinational corporations were far 8.1% behind with and 6.6%, respectively. Foreign-owned establishments had the lowest at 4.7%.
- Union density rate was highest in establishments employing 200 or

more workers at 10.2%. Establishments with 100-199 workers reported a lower rate at 6.0% while those with 20-99 workers had the least at only 2.1%.

EXTENT OF COLLECTIVE BARGAINING


Almost all establishments with unions had CBAs

- Majority or 94.5% (1,946 out of 2,059) of unionized establishments had a Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA) in 2014. In proportion to total establishments however, merely 5.5% (1,946 out of 35,209) have CBAs, down by 3.1 percentage points from 8.6% reported in 2012. (Table 1)
- Remarkably, all reported establishments with union had negotiated a CBA in the following seven (7) industries: construction; information and communication; financial and insurance activities; real estate activities; professional

and technical activities; human health and social work activities except public health activities; and repair of computers and personal and household goods, and other personal service activities. (Table 2)

CBA coverage rate went down to 8.1% in 2014

- With а CBA coverage rate (proportion of employees covered by CBAs to total paid employees) of 8.1%, an equivalent of 359,745 out of the total 4.437 million paid employees were covered by CBAs in 2014. The CBA coverage rate decline showed а of 2.2 percentage points from the 10.3% reported in 2012. (Table 1)
- Specifically, non-agricultural establishments posted lower CBA coverage rate of 7.8% from 9.6%, during the period.
- Higher CBA coverage rate were registered in electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply(36.6%); water supply, sewerage, waste

management and remediation activities (22.5%); and transportation and storage (20.8%). The administrative and support service activities posted the lowest CBA coverage rate at 0.2%. (Figure 2)

- Notably, joint venture establishments had the highest CBA coverage at 11.9% (27,989 out of 235,757 workers). Filipino-owned establishments and multinational companies followed with respective coverage rate of 8.5 and 7.5%. Foreign-owned establishments had the least at 5.2%. (Table 3)
- By employment size, 1 out of every 9 paid employees (10.9%) in large establishments with 200 or more workers was covered by CBA. Lesser coverage rate of 6.4% was reported in establishments with 100-199 workers and merely 2.0% in establishments with 20-99 workers.

EXTENT OF WOMEN PARTICIPATION IN UNIONISM AND COLLECTIVE BARGAINING

Women comprised a little over one-third of union members

- About 34.7% of the 340,370 total union members in 2014 were women. (Table 4)
- By major industry group, a predominance of women union members were reported in the

following industries: repair of and computers personal and household goods, and other personal service activities (84.0%); financial and insurance activities (61.6%);and education except public education (60.2%).

One out of every 7 union presidents was a woman

- Women accounted for 14.6% of the total union leadership (336 out 2,298 union presidents). Notably, all unions in establishments engaged in the repair of computers and personal and household goods; and other personal service activities had women presidents.
- A relatively large proportion of unions were headed by women in private education (48.8%); financial and insurance activities (37.8%); and accommodation and food service activities (35.3%).
- Of the union officers, 1 out of every 5 union officers (20.6%) was a woman. Female union officers dominated their male counterpart specifically in the repair of computers and personal and household goods, other and personal service activities (83.6%); education except public education (56.2%); and accommodation and food service activities (55.5%).
