Occupational Safety and Health Practices in Establishments: CY 2013 (Last of a series on Industrial Relations Practices)


This LABSTAT Updates presents the results of the Occupational Safety and Health (OSH) Practices in establishments, a module in the Industrial Relations Practices of the 2013/2014 Integrated Survey on Labor and Employment (ISLE). The survey covers agricultural and non-agricultural establishments employing 20 or more workers.

Specifically, the module looks into various OSH preventive and control measures/activities implemented in work areas; policies and programs adopted; related trainings/seminars availed by employees; training agencies/organizations that conducted OSH-related trainings/seminars; and designated health and safety personnel in establishments.

The metadata and the statistical tables of the survey are posted at the PSA website.

Smoke-free workplace, top preventive and control measure implemented by establishments against work safety and health hazards

 Establishments conducted various preventive and control measures against safety and health hazards in 2013 in order to protect the workers from exposure to harm and danger in the workplace. Of the total 34,579 establishments, 3 out of every 4 establishments implemented *smoke-free workplace* (76.9%); *posted safety signage and warnings in the workplace* (76.6%); and *conducted regular inspection and maintenance of equipment* (74.9%). 
- control Other preventive and that measures were conducted include maintenance of mechanical and electrical facilities (71.4%); workers' orientation on safety and health hazards at work (69.9%); emergency response preparedness activities earthquake, for chemical spills, etc. (68.9%);periodic/annual medical exam of
- workers (68.8%); and appointment of safety/health officers and/or first-aiders (61.4%).
- Meanwhile, the adoption of DOTS (Directly Observed Treatment Short Course) in management or referral of workers with tuberculosis was the least adopted preventive measure at 22.5%.(Table 1)

Posting of safety signages or warnings implemented by almost all establishments in construction

- The construction industry reported the biggest proportion of establishments (98.3% or 1,024) that implemented posting of safety signages and warnings as their preventive control measure against work safety and health hazards. This was also undertaken in arts, entertainment and recreation (91.5% or 227); private human
- health and social work activities (91.4% or 838) and mining and quarrying (90.5% or 171). (Table 1)
- Smoke-free workplace on the other hand was the most common measure implemented in private human health and social work activities at 91.7% (841).

3 out of every 5 establishments had emergency response preparedness program and drug-free workplace policy

 Establishments adopted various policies and programs on OSH in 2013. Specifically, emergency response preparedness and drug-free workplace were the most implemented OSH policies/programs, posting 59.3% and 59.1% shares, respectively. (Figure 2)



 Other OSH policies/programs commonly identified by establishments were accident prevention (55.6%); accident investigation (51.3%); anti-sexual harassment in the workplace (48.7%); monitoring/surveillance of occupational and work-related injuries and illnesses (45.3%); and healthy lifestyle (42.8%).

6 out of every 7 establishments in arts, entertainment and recreation industry had drug-free workplace policy

- By major industry group, widely adopted policies/programs OSH include drug-free workplace in arts, entertainment and recreation (85.1%); and electricity, gas, steam air conditioning and supply (83.4%); accident prevention in construction (78.9%); anti-sexual harassment in private human health and social work activities (77.2%);
- and emergency response preparedness in both private human health and social work activities (75.8%); and transportation and storage (73.0%). (Table 2)
- Specifically, hearing conservation was the least implemented program in 12 out of 18 industries.

Fire Safety most frequently conducted OSH-related training

- Nearly 75.0% (25,857) of the total establishments provided various occupational safety and healthrelated trainings/seminars to their employees in 2013. (Table 3)
- By type of training, 4 out of every 5 establishments (82.3%) availed of Fire Safety Training. This was
- followed far behind by *Emergency Preparedness* at 55.4%. (*Figure 3*)
- Other trainings/seminars also provided to employees include Drug-Free Workplace Training (32.5%);
 40-Hour Basic OSH Training (31.5%);
 Smoke-Free Workplace/Tobacco Control in the



Workplace (31.4%); 1-Day OSH Orientation (26.8%); Stress Management (24.3%); and Safety Audit/Accident Investigation (23.2%). Very few establishments had Ergonomics Training at 9.4%. (Table 3)


 Industry-wise, Fire Safety Training was availed by employees in

majority of the establishments in health human and social activities (88.5%);professional, scientific and technical activities (88.3%); electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply (87.0%); estate activities (86.9%); real manufacturing (86.5%);and information and communication (86.1%). (Table 3)

2 out of every 3 establishments conducted OSH-related trainings/seminars to their own employees


- A little over two-thirds (67.1%) of the total establishments with OSH trainings/seminars had conducted the needed OSH trainings/seminars to their own employees. The remaining (32.9%) tapped the services of other training agencies. (Figure 4)
- Agencies primarily tapped to conduct OSH-related trainings were

Bureau the of Fire Protection (55.2%); Occupational Safety and Health Center (18.3);**DOLE** Safety Training Accredited Organizations (15.3%); Professional Organizations (7.9%); Employers' (2.5%);**Organizations** Academe/Universities (2.0%) and Workers' Groups (0.9%). (Table 4)



7 out of every 10 establishments had designated safety and health personnel

- Of the total 34,579 establishments 69.5% (24,027) had a designated safety and health personnel to attend to the medical needs of workers in the workplace.
- Of these, a little over half of the establishments designated a safety officer (57.7%) and trained firstaiders (51.3%) while 1 out of
- every 3 establishments had an occupational health registered nurse (35.0%).
- Other establishments had occupational health physicians (24.7%) and dentists (10.7%) as their designated safety and health personnel. (Figure 5)
