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KEY LABOR MARKET INDICATORS FROM ADMINISTRATIVE DATA

(Job Vacancies and Placements, Overseas Deployment and Job Displacements: January-July 2002)

Overview

This report brings together three (3) sets of administrative-based data that provide some indications on the labor market situation in the country, namely: (1) job placements/assistance reported under the various employment facilitation efforts of all Public Employment Service Offices (PESOs) in the country including placements through the conduct of jobs fair and those reported by Local Recruitment Agencies (LRAs); (2) overseas deployment from the Philippine Overseas Employment Administration (POEA) and (3) job displacements due to economic reasons based on termination reports submitted by employers to DOLE ROs.

- More than half a million job vacancies or 748,000 were solicited/reported during the first seven months of 2002, upped 19.4 percent from last year of same period.
- About two-thirds (65.9% or 493,560) of total vacancies were reported through the PESOs - mainly through its regular facilitation program (391,094) and SPES (96,284).
- A total of 255,172 vacancies were also made available through the jobs fair held during the period.
- A total of 503,443 persons received various forms of employment assistance from the PESOs for the first seven months of the year, an increase of 33.7 percent from the year ago level.
- Job placements accounted for the bulk of the assistance provided at 309,586 or 61.5 percent. This includes the combined placement efforts under the regular facilitation program, SPES, WAP, TULAY 2000 and others.
- Other forms of assistance were likewise provided to some 165,767 applicants who were reported to have engaged in self-employment or underwent skills training after seeking assistance from the PESOs. Region I reported the biggest share to these efforts at 85.2 percent or 141,248.
- The DOLE also monitored 30,650 placements made through the private recruitment/placement agencies.

Overseas Deployment

- Overseas jobs continue to lure many Filipinos to work abroad. Total deployment for the first seven (7) months of this year was placed at 558,376 as indicated by data from the Philippine Overseas Employment Administration.
- This figure translates to an average of 2,700 Filipinos leaving the country each day to seek for more competitive jobs in the overseas labor market.

Job Displacements

- Between the period January 1 to July 31, a total of 51,895 workers from 2,173 establishments were permanently separated from their jobs due to economic reasons.
- The bulk of the job losses were reported during the first three months January (10,869),February March (9,912).(10,088)and Thereafter. iob losses declined substantially in the succeeding months of April (5,191), May (5,381), June (6,680) and July (3,774).
- Reorganization/downsizing/redundanc y accounted for the biggest number of workers retrenched during this period (33.6% or 17,427 workers). Lack of market/ slump in demand ranked a close second (30.4% or 15,792 workers) followed by financial losses (18.3% or 9,501 workers) and change in management/ merger (3.9% or 2,042 workers).
