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HIGHLIGHTS OF THE OCTOBER 2003 LABOR FORCE SURVEY

Overview

The Philippine labor market performed better than expected in October 2003, as revealed in the latest Labor Force Survey (LFS) conducted by the National Statistics Office (NSO). Employment level grew by a respectable 4.2 percent and was broadly based with all three major sectors contributing to the overall growth. The expansion in employment was accompanied by increases in number of persons who found full-time work and wage and salary employment.

The rate on unemployment was unchanged from last year as there was a matching increase in labor force. Similarly, the rate of underemployment rate was of little change from last year.

Labor Force

The size of the country's labor force increased by 1.403 million to reach 35.078 million in October. This translates to a labor force participation rate (LFPR) of 67.1 percent, upped by 0.9 percentage point from last year.

Employment

Total employed persons in October increased by 1.273 million from a year earlier to reach 31.524 million. This implies a year-on-year growth rate of 4.2 percent, a marked improvement from the near zero growth (0.6%) recorded last year.

- ☐ Employment in the combined agriculture, fishery and forestry sector was up 3.2 percent (+364,000), increasing from 11.311 million to 11.675 million.
- □ Industry sector employment grew a robust 5.9 percent (+272,000) largely owing to the strong growth in manufacturing (6.4% or 183,000) and construction (6.2% or 99,000). These offset the employment decline posted in electricity, gas and water (-8.1% or -10,000).
- Nearly one-half (49.7% 633,000) of the total new employment created during the period originated in the service sector. Notable aains were recorded in private households employed with persons (+225,000),transportation, storage and communication (+192,000)and real estate. renting and business activities (+160,000). On the other hand, slump in employment occurred in public administration and social defense. compulsory (-74,000)security and education (-33,000).
- Persons in full-time employment (worked 40 hours or more in the past week) increased by 7.9 percent (+1.471 million). On the other hand, the number of persons in part-time employment fell by 1.4 percent (-159,000).
- Much of the growth in employment occurred among wage and salary workers which grew by 10.0 percent (+1.457 million) over the period. Ownaccount workers also posted a

positive but less than one percent increase (0.5% or +55,000) while unpaid family workers fell (-6.0% or -238,000) during the period.

Gains in employment were observed in all but two regions. bulk of the gain employment occurred in four (4) regions: NCR (+250,000), Region IV-A (+247,000), Region III (+114,000)and ARMM (+109,000). The two regions decline which posted employment were Regions IV-B (-2,000) and IX (-33,000).

Unemployment

Unemployment rate in October 2003 stood at 10.1 percent, down by 0.1 percentage point from a year earlier. In absolute terms, however, the total number of unemployed persons grew by 131,000 over the period, from 3.423 million to 3.554 million. This was a consequence of the continued rise in the country's labor force which expanded by 1.403 million during the period under review.

- The unemployment rates for men (10.0%) and women (10.3%) showed little change from last year.
- Youth (15-24 years old) unemployment rate improved by 1.7 percentage points to 19.7 percent. The rate for those in the prime-working age 25-54 years old was unchanged at 7.3 percent while those 55 years old and over increased from 6.0 percent to 7.1 percent over the period.

Only three regions posted significant changes in unemployment rates, namely: Region IV-B (7.2% to 6.2%), Region V (8.1% to 7.1%) and ARMM (4.4% to 5.4%). There were no significant changes in other regions.

Underemployed Persons

The incidence of underemployment (employed persons who expressed the desire for additional hours/additional jobs/new jobs) increased marginally in October both in terms of rate (15.3% to 15.7%) and number (4.628 million to 4.964 million). Nearly two-thirds (61.6% or 3.059 million) of the total underemployed persons worked less than 40 hours a week or visibly underemployed.
