In a nutshell, these measures propose to establish a Civil Registration and Vital Statistics System that will provide for free accessible, simple and expeditious birth registration for all especially for children with no discrimination. Such a system is envisioned to be more inclusive thru the establishment of a culturally sensitive registration process addressing the unique cultural practices and Identification Systems of these indigenous peoples. With this we will not deprive individuals of their inherent right to identity and recognition as well as civil rights. These would also highlight the Fundamental function of the National Government to record vital events and would help in generating reliable data critical for the crafting of national development plans and monitoring programs across several sectors. Given the importance of these measures to the Filipino populace, rest assured that they will be deliberated at the proper time.

Let me also congratulate all of you under the leadership of Usec Mapa for pushing on with urgency the implementation of the Philsys ID. I cannot emphasize the profound impact these would have on the provision of public and private services and transactions.
