Introduction

Act 3753, commonly known as the Civil Registry Law



Civil Register. – A civil register is established for recording the civil status of persons, in which shall be entered: (a) births; (b) deaths; (c) marriages; (d) annulments of marriages; (e) divorces; (f) legitimations; (g) adoptions; (h) acknowledgment of natural children; (i) naturalization; and (j) changes of name.

RA 11055 , PhilSys Act of 2018



Aims to establish a single national identification system for all citizens and resident aliens of the Republic of the Philippines

- Archiving (lack of enabling laws to digitally store records)

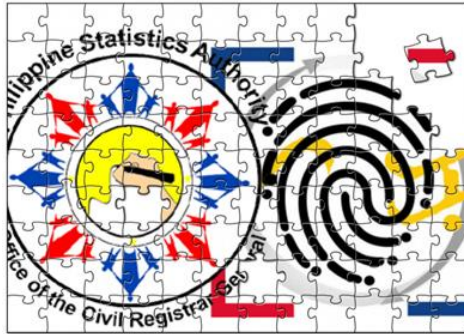


The PhilSys Act of 2018

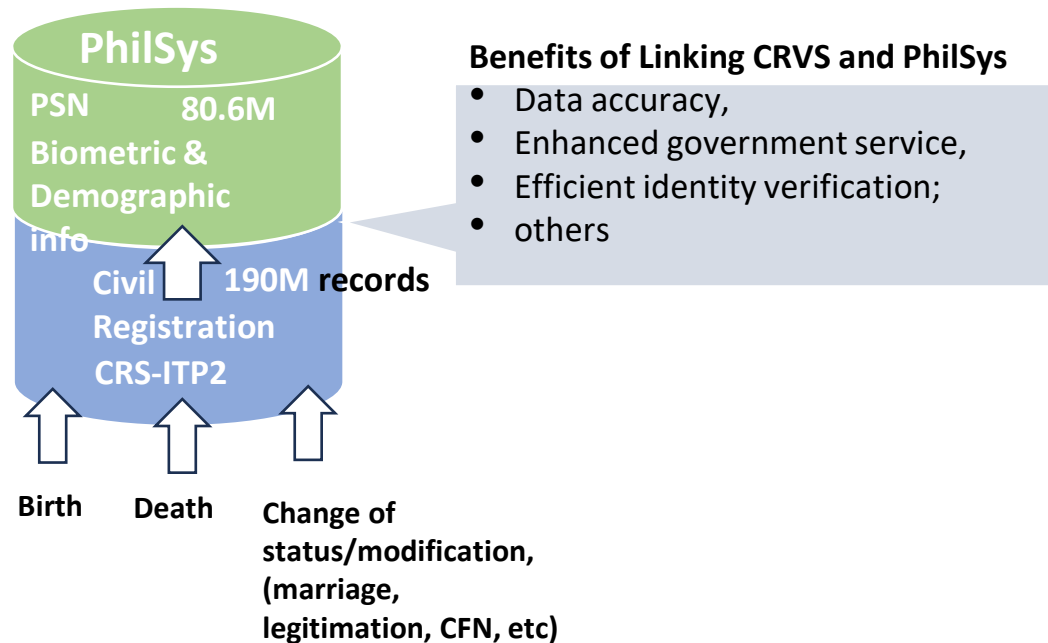

- Integration for Citizens: Seamless access to government services through PhilSys.

Key Questions

1. From the perspective of Local Civil Registry Offices, what are the essential requirements for digitalization and successful integration with PhilSys?
1. For the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA), what is the anticipated timeline for the integration of Civil Registration and Vital Statistics (CRVS) with PhilSys, and what steps are being taken to expedite this process?
