**PSA Board Resolution No. 05
Series of 2018**

**APPROVING AND ENDORSING TO THE OFFICE OF THE PRESIDENT
THE PHILIPPINE STATISTICAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM 2018-2023**

WHEREAS, Republic Act (RA) No. 10625 or "The Philippine Statistical Act of 2013," provides for the preparation of the Philippine Statistical Development Program (PSDP) by the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA);

WHEREAS, the PSDP sets the strategic directions, thrusts and priorities of the Philippine Statistical System (PSS) in the medium term to provide vital information support to national, sectoral and local development plans, and international commitments;

WHEREAS, the PSDP provides the necessary framework for the development, generation, and dissemination of statistics and indicators needed in evidence-based policies, plans, and decisions of government and other key stakeholders and data users at the local and national levels;

WHEREAS, the PSDP 2018-2023 represents the convergence of stakeholders in the PSS towards a solid, responsive, innovative statistical system for an empowered Philippines by 2023;

WHEREAS, the PSDP 2018-2023 was formulated to address the data requirements of priority development programs set forth in the medium-term Philippine Development Plan (PDP) 2017-2022, among others;

WHEREAS, the PDP 2017-2022 was published with the Results Matrices in 2017 *"to lay down the foundation for inclusive growth, high-trust and resilient society, and a globally-competitive knowledge economy;"*

WHEREAS, other major organizational developments and information demands surfaced within and about the PSS, such as the: Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs); ASEAN economic integration; the Asian and Pacific Civil Registration and Vital Statistics Decade; use of other sources of data (big data, citizen-generated data, administrative data, registers); data revolution; data ecosystems;

WHEREAS, considering these recent developments and consistent with RA 10625's mandate for the PSDP to be responsive to the requirements of development planning and policy formulation, the PSA spearheaded the formulation of the PSDP 2018-2023 in collaboration with existing statistical interagency and regional statistics committees;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board approve the PSDP 2018-2023 and endorse the same to the Office of the President for issuance of an Executive Order (Annex BR-05-20180509-01) enjoining its adoption and implementation by concerned government departments/agencies;

BE IT RESOLVED FURTHER, that the Board:


- 1) enjoin all agencies in the PSS to cooperate in the implementation of the PSDP 2018-2023;
- 2) enjoin all concerned agencies to prepare and submit annual report on the status of the statistical development programs to the PSA, for presentation to the PSA Board;
- 3) coordinate with the DBM for the allocation of financial and human resources required for the implementation of the PSDP 2018-2023 as well as for its monitoring and evaluation; and
- 4) enjoin the PSA to disseminate and communicate the PSDP 2018-2023 to all stakeholders in government, the private sector, media, academe and development partners and to periodically monitor and evaluate its implementation.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. ____

**ADOPTING THE
PHILIPPINE STATISTICAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM (PSDP) 2018-2023
AND ENJOINING CONCERNED GOVERNMENT AGENCIES AND
INSTRUMENTALITIES TO IMPLEMENT THE SAME**

WHEREAS, Republic Act (RA) No. 10625 reorganized the Philippine Statistical System (PSS) and established the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) as the central statistical authority of the Philippine government;

WHEREAS, RA 10625 provides for the preparation of the Philippine Statistical Development Program (PSDP) by the PSA;

WHEREAS, the PSDP 2018-2023 represents the convergence of stakeholders in the PSS towards a solid, responsive, innovative statistical system for an empowered Philippines;

WHEREAS, the PSDP sets the strategic directions, thrusts and priorities of the PSS in the medium term in order to provide vital information support to the Philippine Development Plan (PDP), sectoral and local development plans, the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and other international commitments;

WHEREAS, the PSDP provides the necessary framework for the generation, dissemination and utilization of statistics and indicators needed in evidence-based policies, plans, and decisions of government and other key stakeholders and data users at the local and national levels;

WHEREAS, major organizational developments and information demands surfaced within and about the PSS, such as the: SDGs; ASEAN economic integration; the Asian and Pacific Civil Registration and Vital Statistics Decade; use of other sources of data (big data, citizen-generated data, administrative data, registers); data revolution; data ecosystems;

WHEREAS, considering these recent developments and consistent with RA 10625's mandate for the PSDP to be responsive to the requirements of development planning and policy formulation, the PSA spearheaded the formulation of the PSDP 2018-2023 in collaboration with existing statistical interagency and regional statistics committees;

WHEREAS, the PSA Board approved the PSDP 2018-2023 for endorsement to the President through PSA Board Resolution No. 05, s. 2018;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, RODRIGO ROA DUTERTE, President of the Philippines, by virtue of the powers vested in me by the Constitution and existing laws, do hereby order:

SECTION 1. Philippine Statistical Development Program 2018-2023. The PSDP 2018-2023 is hereby approved. This will serve as the statistical support framework to the PDP 2017-2022, sectoral and local development plans, the SDGs, among others. All concerned agencies in the government are hereby enjoined to adopt, support, fully implement and provide the necessary resources to the statistical programs and activities provided in the PSDP 2018-2023.

SECTION 2. Coordination with the PSDP Steering Committee and Secretariat. All concerned government agencies are also hereby enjoined to work with the PSDP Steering Committee in carrying out statistical development programs and activities for the PSDP, including the appropriation of necessary budgets therefor. The PSDP Steering Committee may call upon the participation of concerned government agencies in coordinating meetings of the committees that may be organized to ensure the implementation of the PSDP 2018-2023. All concerned government agencies, in coordination with the PSA and the PSDP Steering Committee, shall prepare and submit annual report for presentation to the PSA Board.

The PSA, as coordinator of the PSS, shall monitor and evaluate the implementation of the statistical programs and activities specified in the PSDP 2018-2023 in accordance with the goals of the PSS.

SECTION 3. Funding. The government, through the Department of Budget and Management (DBM), shall strive to provide the necessary resources to implement the statistical programs and activities of the PSDP 2018-2023.

The PSA, in coordination with DBM, shall prepare a medium term expenditure framework to ensure rational expenditure planning and efficient resource mobilization consistent with the annual cash-based appropriation system, and with focus on implementation readiness of the programs, results-orientation, and the absorptive capacity of the agency.

SECTION 4. Advocacy. The private sector and civil society are encouraged to support and actively participate in the activities of the PSDP 2018-2023, especially as respondents to censuses and surveys and sources of data for the compilation of official statistics. The media is invited to assist the PSA in promoting the PSDP 2018-2023 and educating the citizenry about statistics and its usefulness.

SECTION 5. Separability Clause. Any portion or provision of this Executive Order that may be declared unconstitutional shall not have the effect of nullifying other portions or provisions hereof, as long as such remaining portions or provisions can still subsist and be given effect in their entirety;

SECTION 6. Repealing Clause. All other orders, guidelines, rules, regulations, and issuances or parts thereof which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Order are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SECTION 7. Effectivity. The Executive Order shall take effect immediately upon its approval.
