

**HEALTH AND NUTRITION SECTOR – Batch 4**

*Note: Metadata for the statistical concepts for the health and nutrition sector, which are defined below, are provided in Annex BR-07-20120601-01b.*

1. **Vital statistics** - Records of vital events from civil registration, which involve the continuous gathering of information on all relevant vital events occurring within the boundaries of a country.
2. **Live birth** - The complete expulsion or extraction from the mother of a product of conception, irrespective of the duration of pregnancy, which after such separation, breathes or shows any other evidence of life, such as beating of the heart, pulsation of the umbilical cord, or definite movement of voluntary muscles, whether or not the umbilical cord has been cut or the placenta is attached.
3. **Death** - The permanent disappearance of all evidence of life at any time after live birth has taken place (postnatal cessation of vital functions without capability of resuscitation).
4. **Antenatal care coverage (at least one visit)** - The number of women aged 15-49 years with a live birth in a given time period who received antenatal care provided by skilled health personnel at least once during pregnancy expressed as a percentage of all women aged 15-49 years with a live birth in the same time period.
5. **Antenatal care coverage (at least four visits)** - The number of women aged 15-49 years with a live birth in a given time period who received antenatal care provided by skilled health personnel four or more times during pregnancy expressed as a percentage of all women aged 15-49 years with a live birth in the same time period.
6. **Unmet need for family planning (%)** - The number of fecund women who are married or in consensual unions, and who either do not want any more children or want to delay the next child, but are not using any method of family planning expressed as a percentage of all women who are married or in a consensual union.
7. **Complementary feeding** - The process starting when breast milk alone is no longer sufficient to meet the nutritional requirements of infants and therefore, other foods and liquids are needed, along with breast milk.
8. **Proportion of infants under 6 months old who are exclusively breastfed** - The number of infants under 6 months old who are fed exclusively with breast milk as a proportion of all infants under 6 months old.
9. **Prevalence of underweight children under five years of age** - The number of children aged 0-59 months whose weights for age are less than two standard deviations below the median weight for age of the World Health Organization-Child Growth Standards (WHO-CGS) in a given time period expressed as a percentage of all children aged 0-59 months who were weighed in the same time period.
10. **Proportion of households with per capita energy intake less than 100% adequacy** - The number of households with per capita energy intake less than 100% adequacy in a given time period expressed as a percentage of all households in the same time period.
11. **Proportion of the population with mean one-day energy intake less than 100% adequacy** - The number of individuals aged 6 months and above with per capita energy intake less than 100% adequacy in a given time period expressed as a percentage of the total number of individuals aged 6 months and above in the same time period.

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
