## APPROVING THE METHODOLOGY FOR COMPILING THE PHILIPPINE TOURISM SATELLITE ACCOUNTS

## Methodology

#### Table 1: Inbound Tourism Expenditure

Total inbound tourism expenditure is the sum of the product of:

- total inbound visitor arrivals (r)
- average length of stay (I)
- average daily expenditures for each of the expenditure items (e)

$$TE_v = \sum_{i=1}^7 \left[ (r) \cdot (l) \cdot (e_i) \right]$$

*i* refers to the expenditure items, namely:

- 1. accommodation services for visitors
- 2. food and beverage serving services
- 3. transport services
- 4. travel agencies and other reservation services
- 5. entertainment and recreation
- 6. country specific tourism characteristic goods (shopping)
- 7. miscellaneous

#### Table 2: Domestic Tourism Expenditure

Total domestic tourism expenditure is the sum of the product of:

- total annual domestic visitor trips (r)
- average length of stay (I)
- average daily expenditures by expenditure items (e)

$$TE_{domestic} = \sum_{i=1}^{7} \left[ (r) \cdot (l) \cdot (e_i) \right]$$

*i* refers to the expenditure items, namely:

- 1. accommodation services for visitors
- 2. food and beverage serving services
- 3. transport services
- 4. travel agencies and other reservation services
- 5. entertainment and recreation
- 6. country specific tourism characteristic goods (shopping)
- 7. miscellaneous

## Table 3: Outbound Tourism Expenditure

Total expenditure of Filipinos abroad is estimated as the sum of the product of:

- total outbound visitors (r)
- average length of stay (I) and
- average expenditures for each of the expenditure items (e)

$$TE_{v} = \sum_{i=1}^{7} \left[ (r) \cdot (l) \cdot (e_{i}) \right]$$

*i* refers to the expenditure items, namely:

- 1. accommodation services for visitors
- 2. food and beverage serving services
- 3. transport services
- 4. travel agencies and other reservation services
- 5. entertainment and recreation
- 6. country specific tourism characteristic goods (shopping)
- 7. miscellaneous

### **Table 4: Internal Tourism Expenditure**

Internal tourism expenditure is the sum of inbound (Table 1) and domestic tourism expenditure (Table 2) plus the expenditure paid in behalf of visitors

 $TE_{int ernal} = TE_{inbound} + TE_{domestic} + TE_{inbehalf}$ 

#### Table 5: Production accounts of tourism & non-tourism industries

Table 5 presents the production accounts of tourism industries and other industries in the economy of reference

It conforms to the format established in the SNA 1993 where:

- 1) output is broken down by product, followed by
- 2) intermediate consumption (also called intermediate inputs)

The difference between these two values is called gross value added (GVA)

# Table 6: Total domestic supply and internal tourism consumption

Table 6 is an extension of Table 5

The rows of table 6 are identical to those of table 5 with additional columns on the following:

- 1) Tourism ratio (%);
- 2) Tourism share;
- 3) Imports, taxes less subsidies and trade and transport margins

#### **Table 7: Employment of Tourism Industries**

Number of persons employed in each of the identified tourism-characteristic industry
